REMARKS BY AMBASSADOR OF INDIA TO JAPAN H.E. SHRI SIBI GEORGE ON THE OCCASION OF THE ONAM CELEBRATIONS AT THE EMBASSY, SEPT 4, 2023

Good Evening everybody,

A very warm welcome to Embassy of India.

I extend my greetings to all Indians in Japan on the occasion of Onam festival.

This satellite will have the major advantage of continuously viewing the Sun without any eclipses. This will provide a greater advantage of observing the solar activities and its effect on space weather in real time. It is another proud movement for ISRO, Indian scientists and of course for every Indian in India and abroad. Let's join hands to congratulate ISRO and our scientists on these remarkable achievements. We will soon hold a special event to celebrate India's Space Program, its Moon and Sun Missions.
